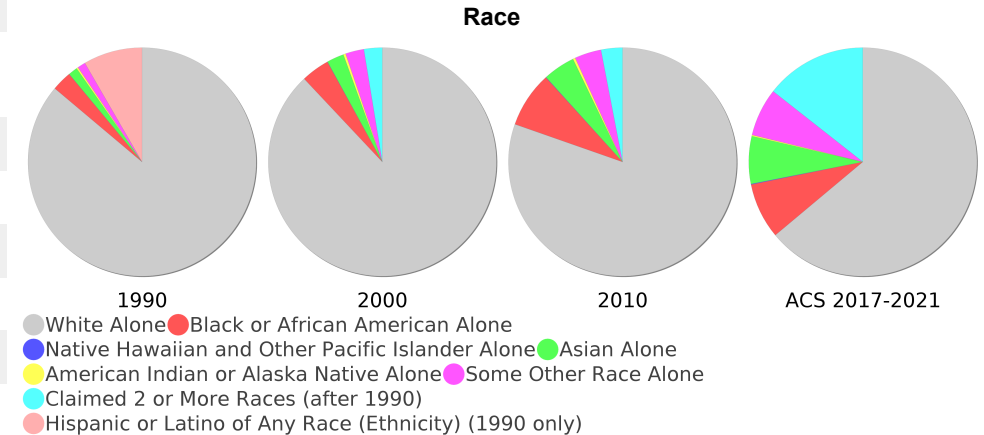

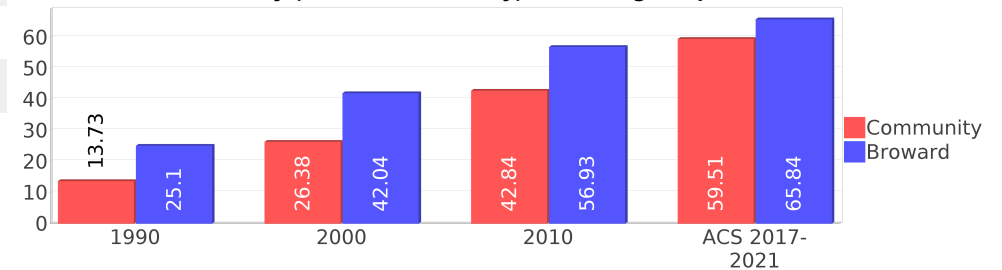

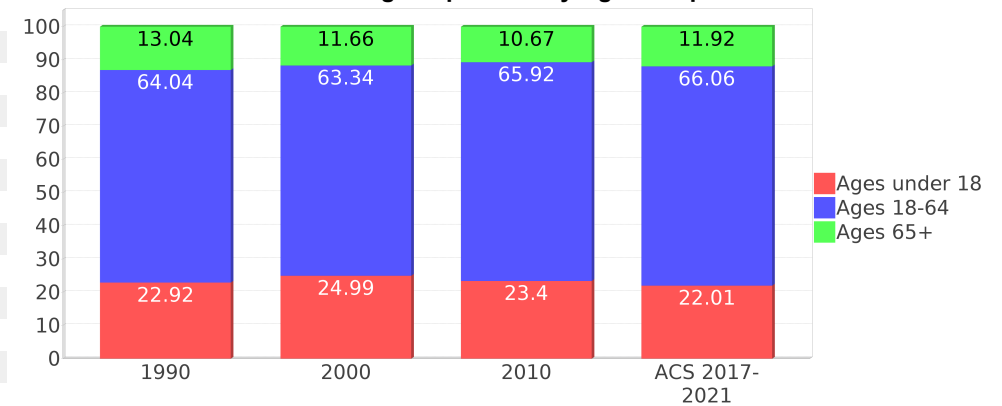
Minority (Race and Ethnicity) Percentage Population

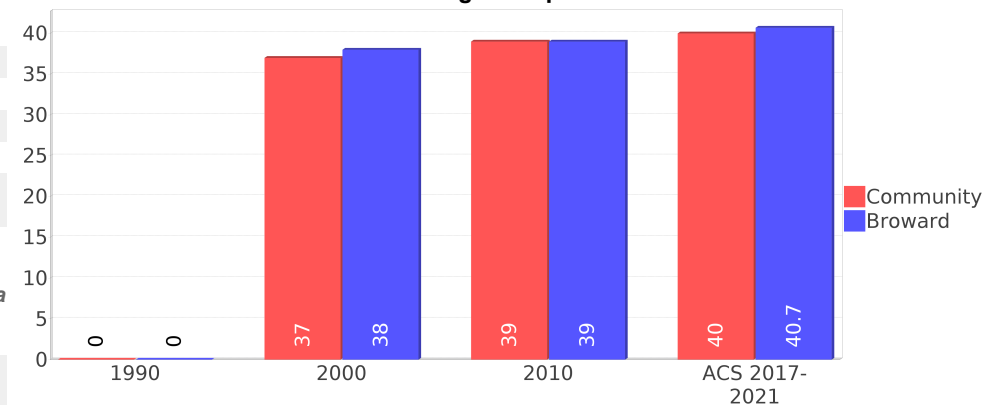
Percentage Population by Age Group

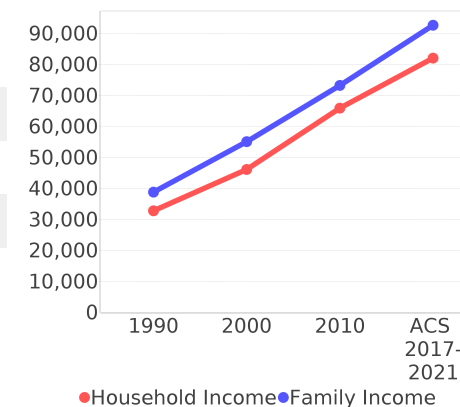

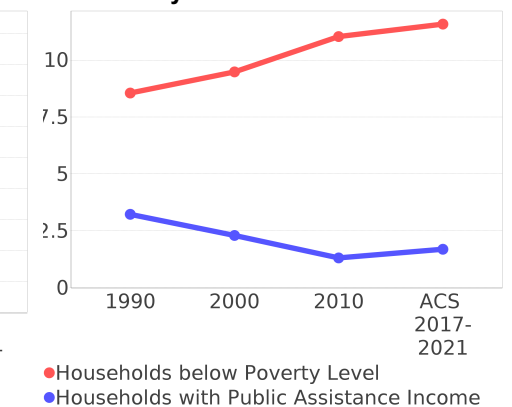

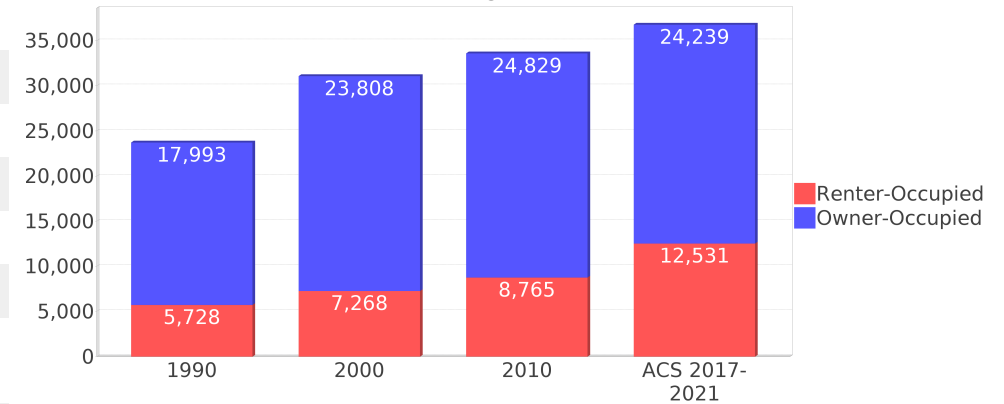

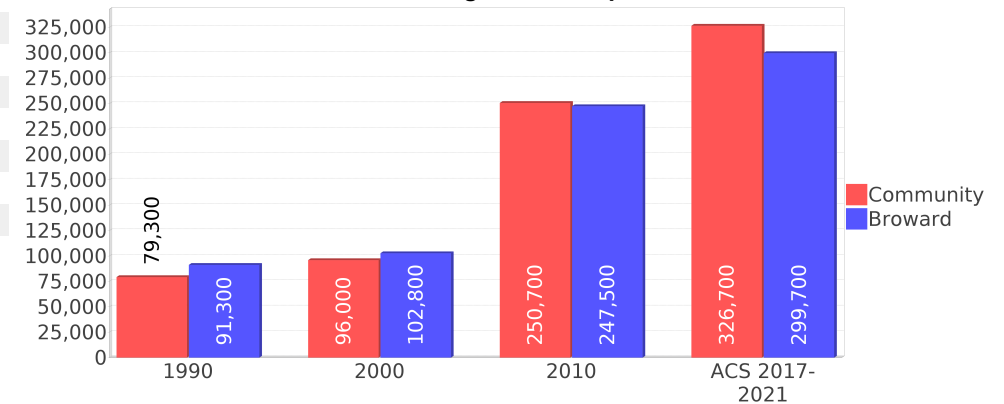

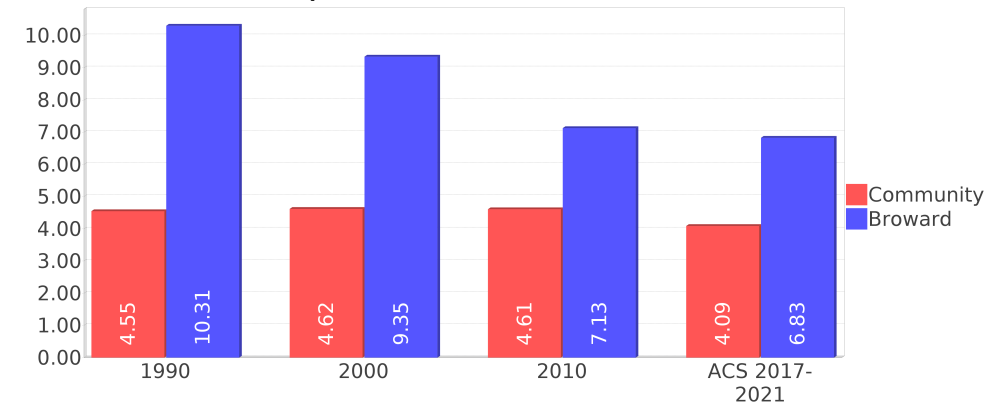
Housing Tenure

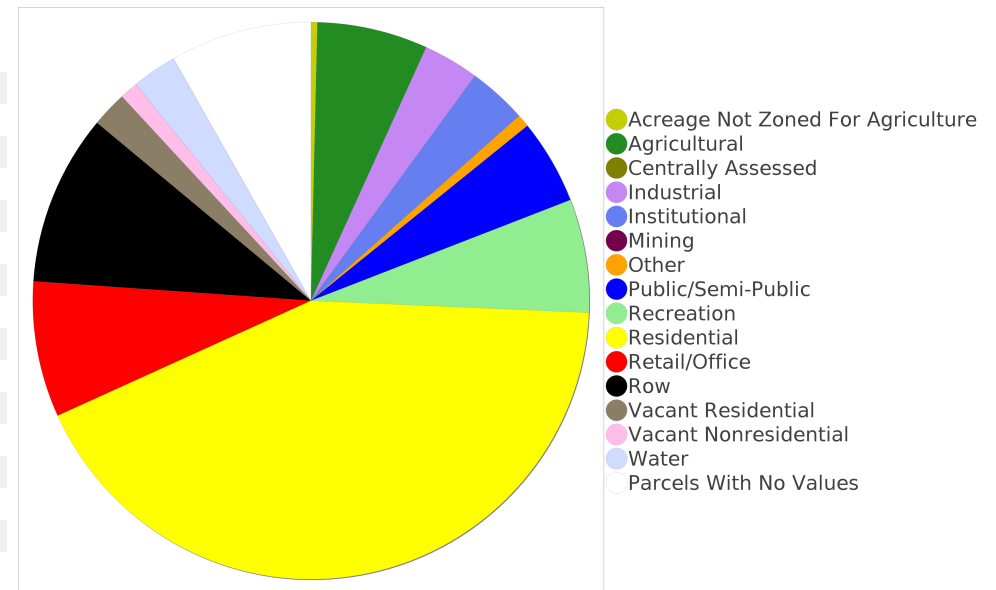

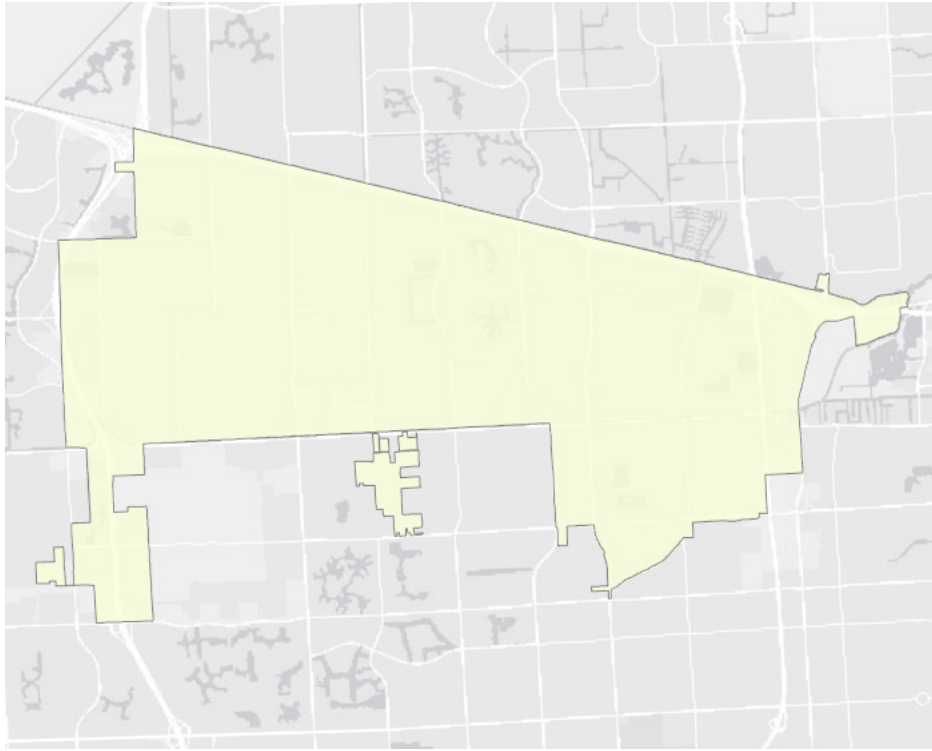

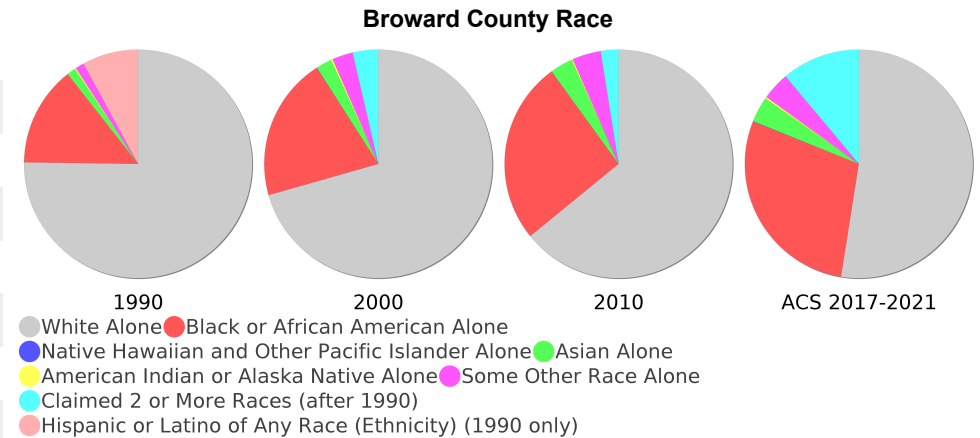

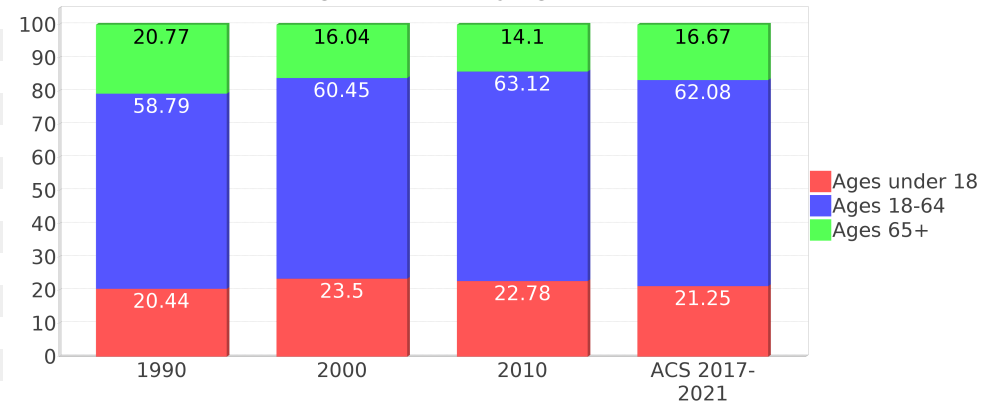

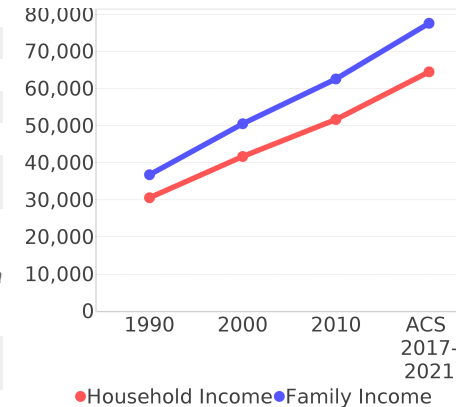
Percentage Population by Age Group - Broward



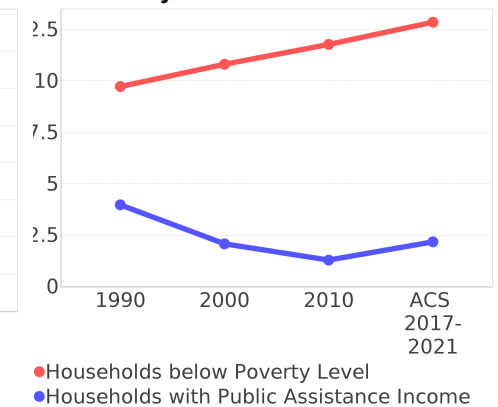

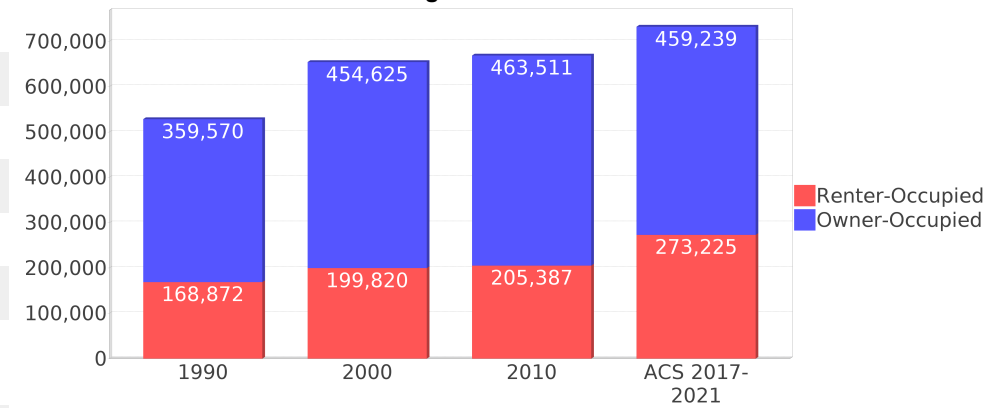

Area
