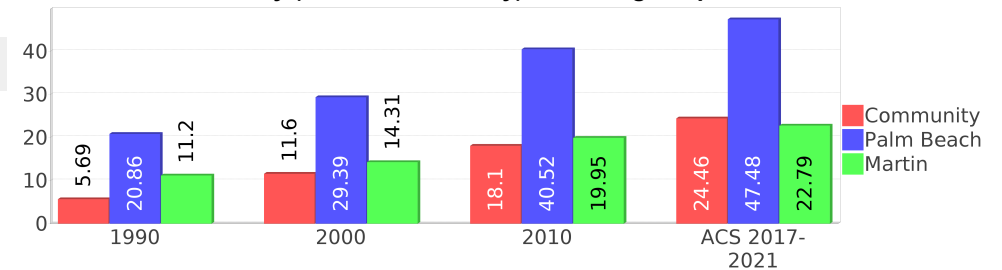

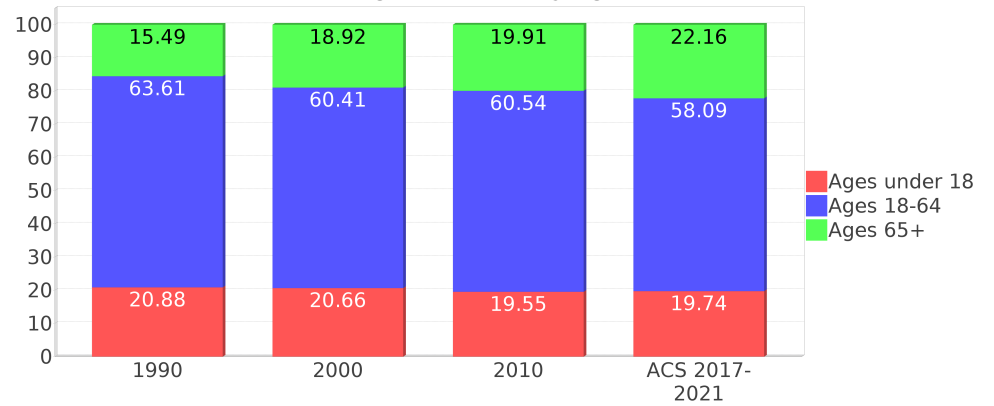
Minority (Race and Ethnicity) Percentage Population

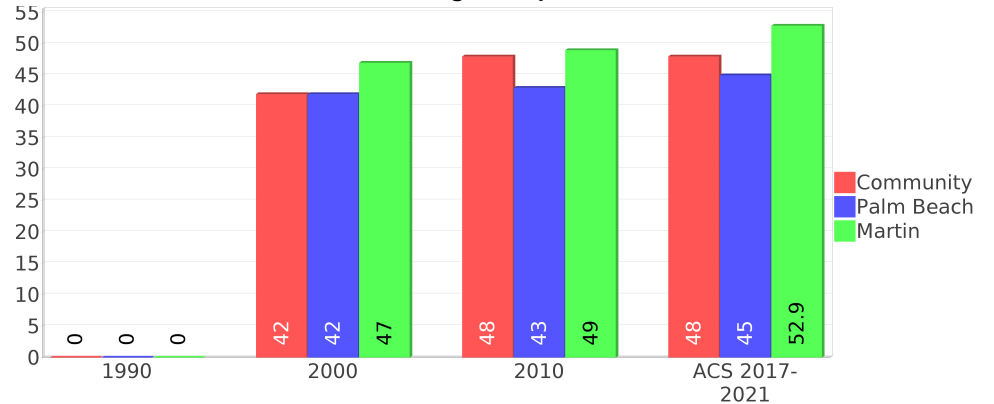
Percentage Population by Age Group

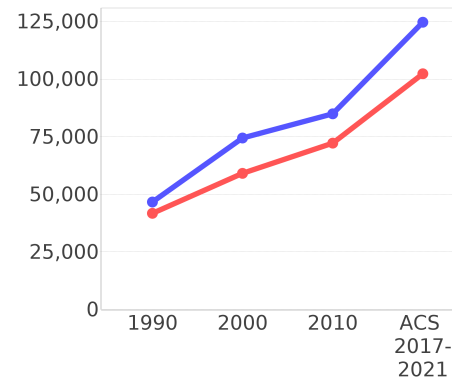

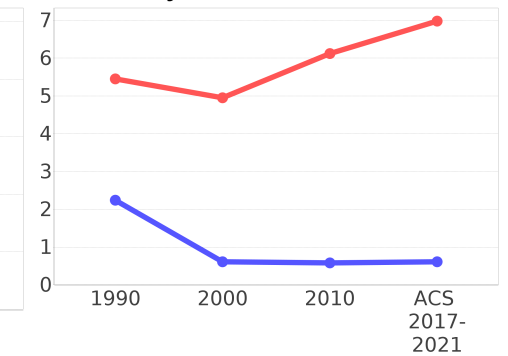

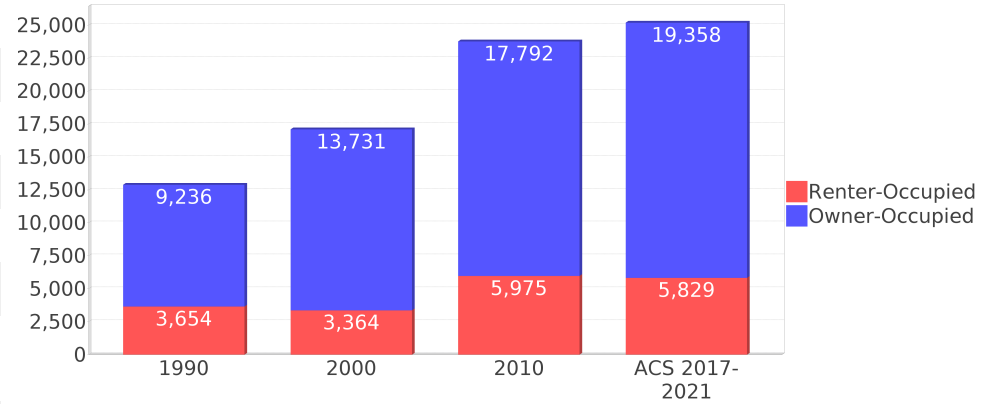

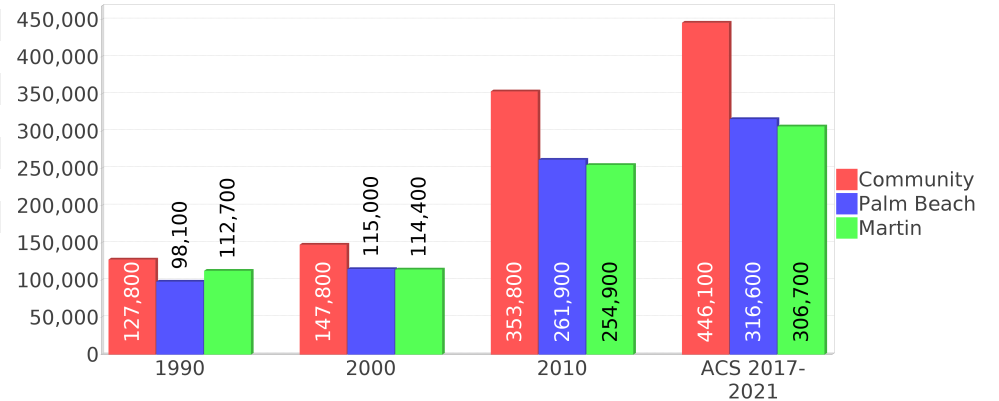

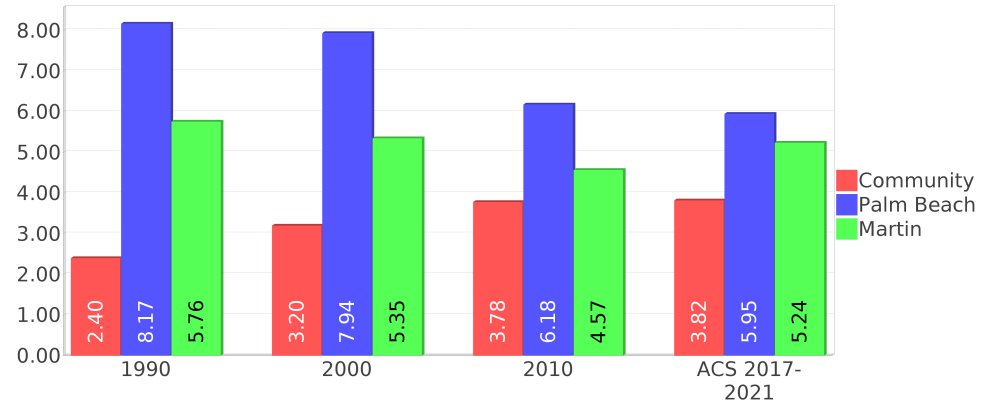
Housing Tenure

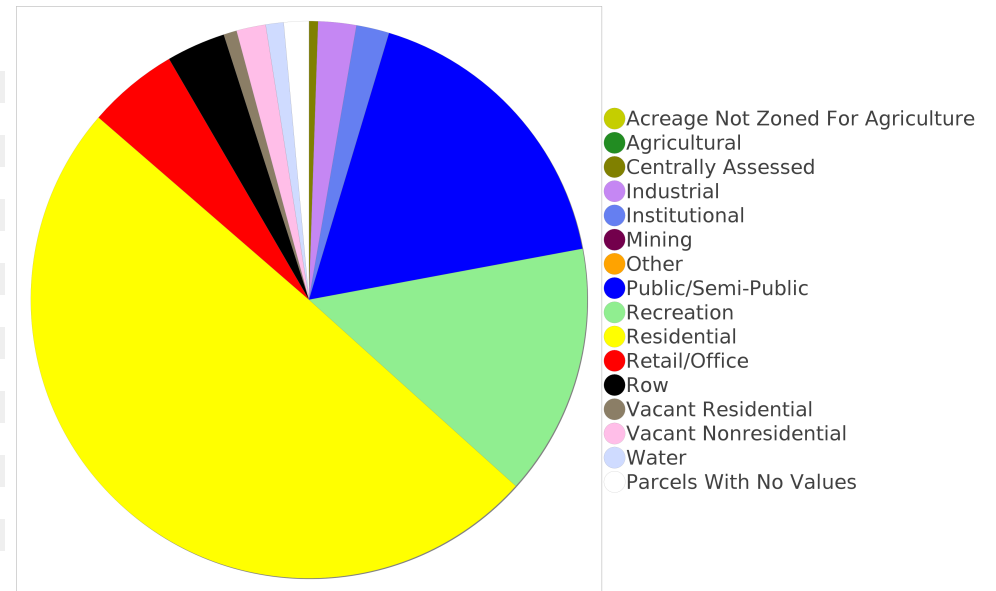

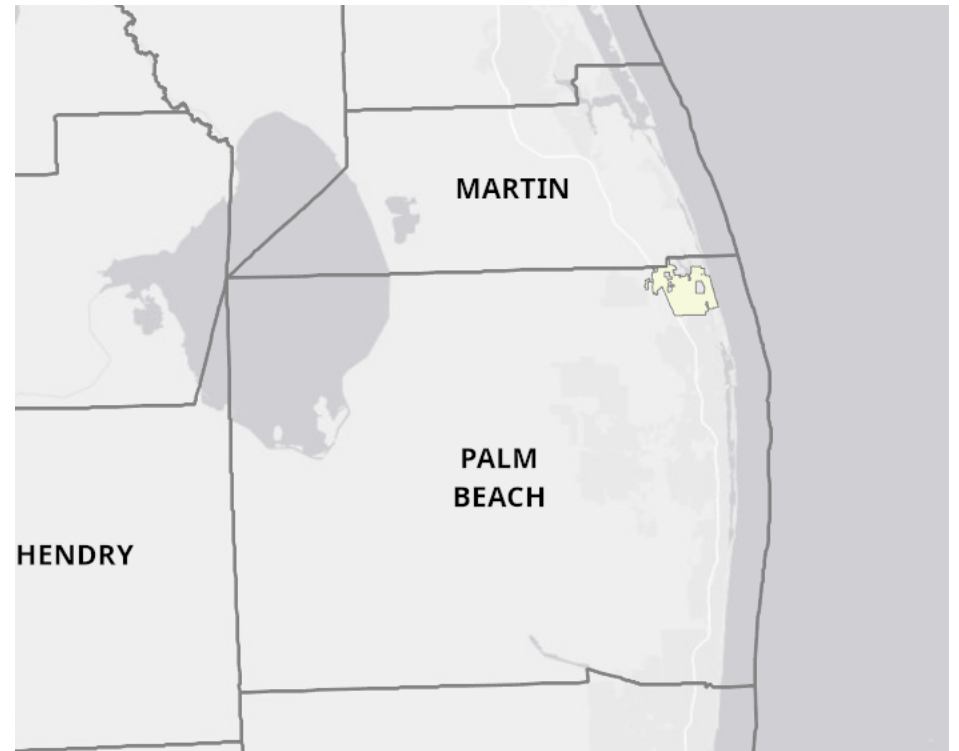

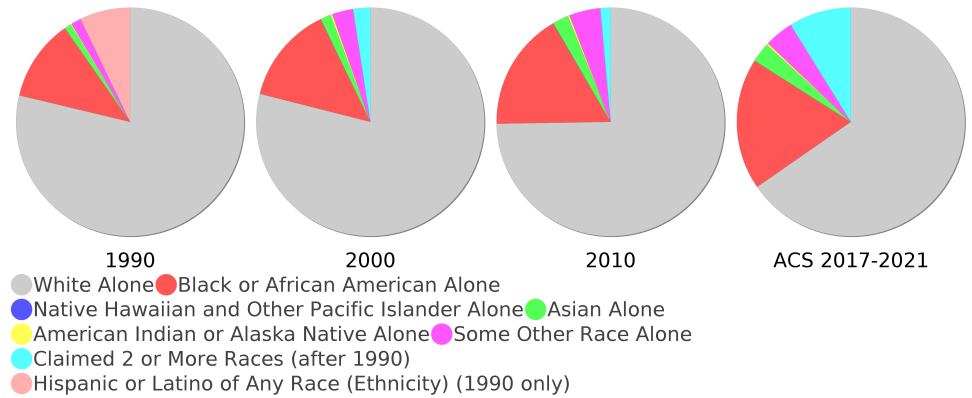

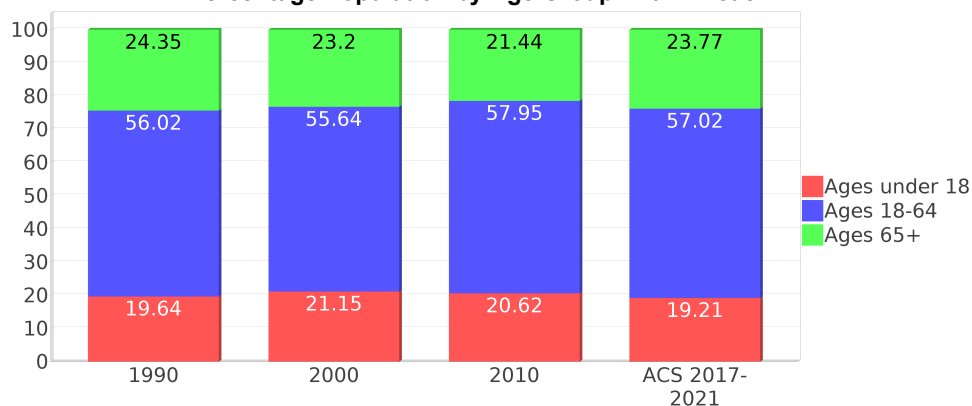

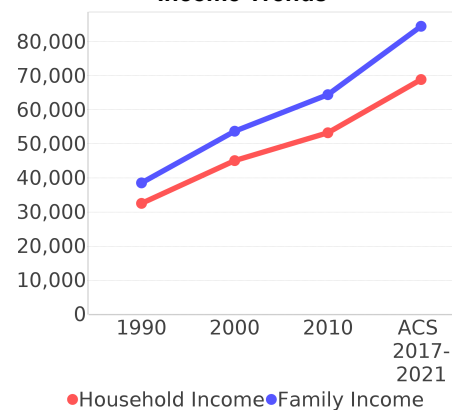
Percentage Population by Age Group - Palm Beach



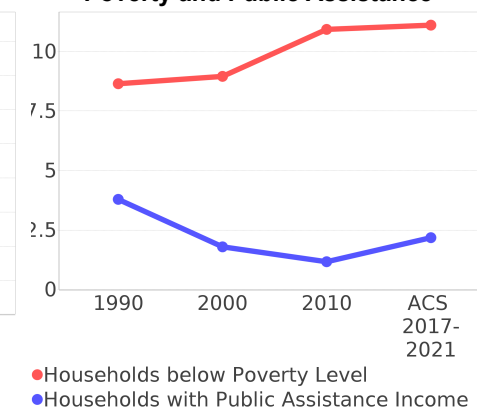

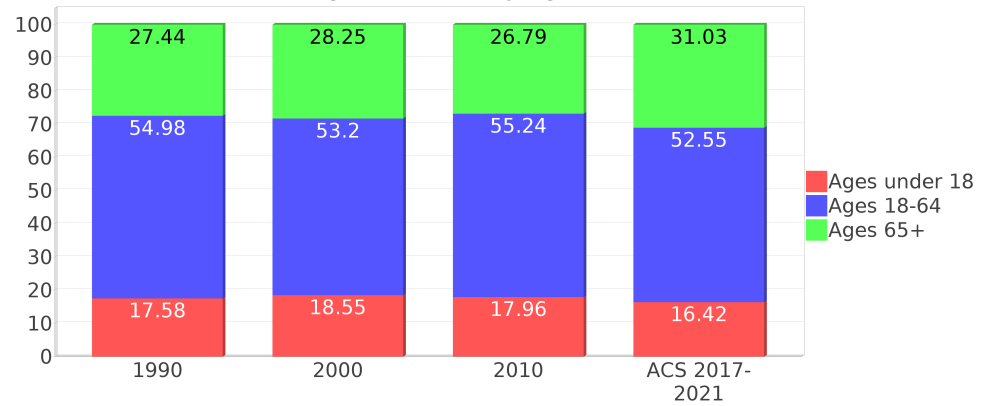

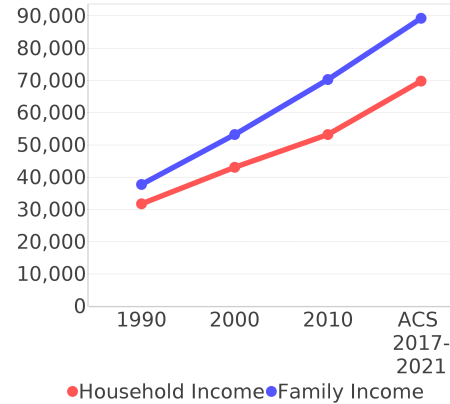
Percentage Population by Age Group - Martin



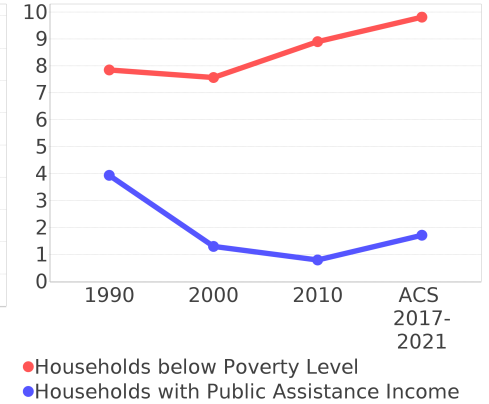

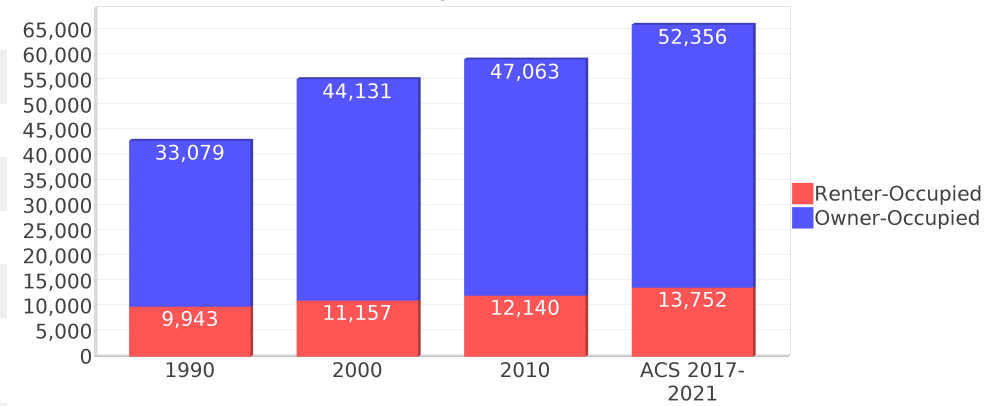

(5) Demographic data reported under the headings General Population Trends, Race and Ethnicity Trends, Age Trends, Income Trends, Educational Attainment Trends, Language Trends, and Housing Trends is from the U.S. Decennial Census for 1990 and 2000 and the American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates for 2006-2010 and ACS 2017-2021.
