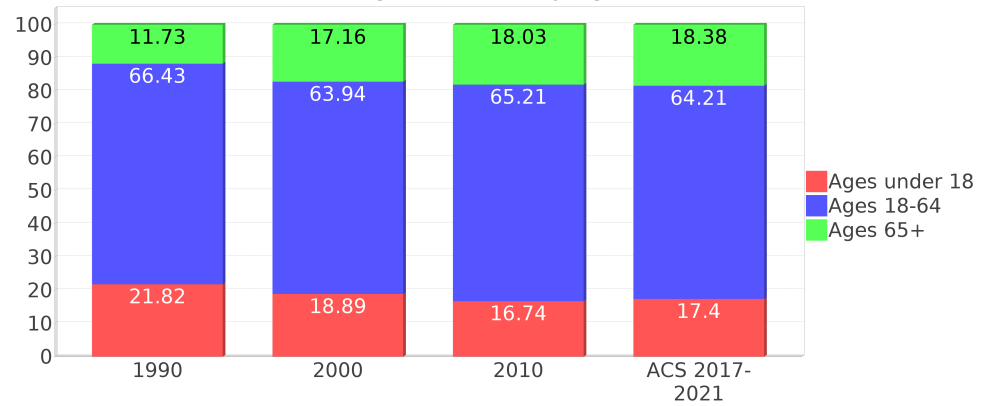

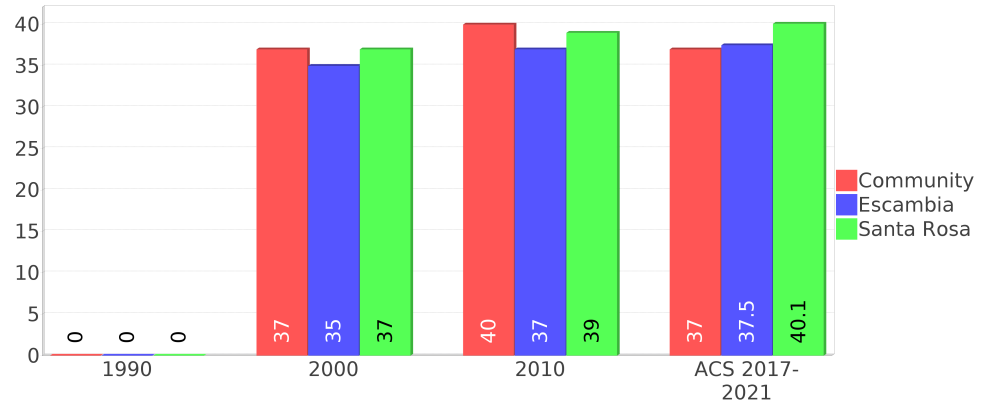
Percentage Population by Age Group

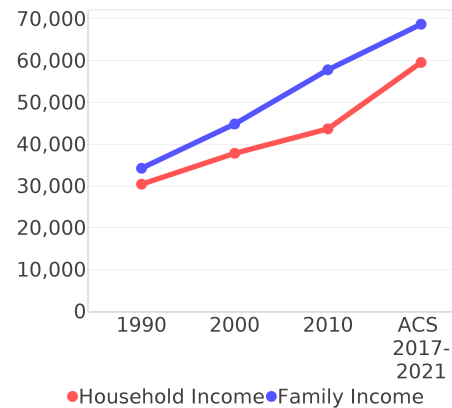

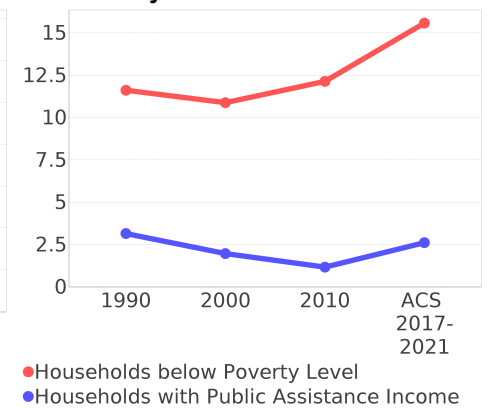

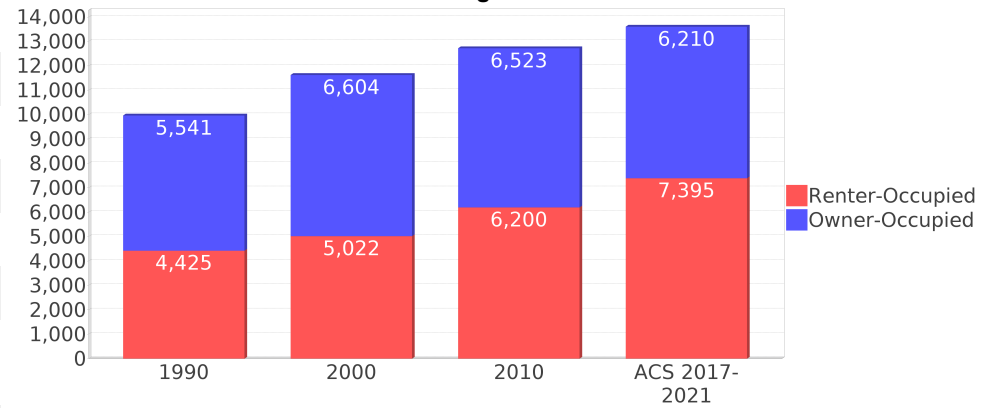

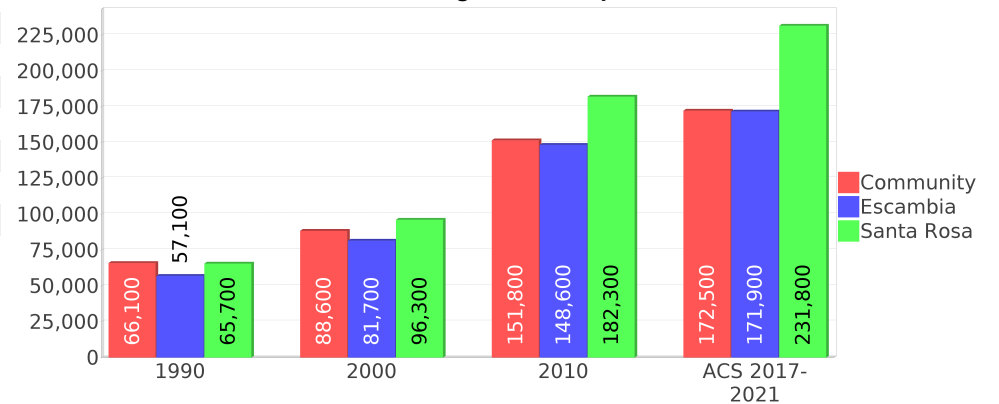

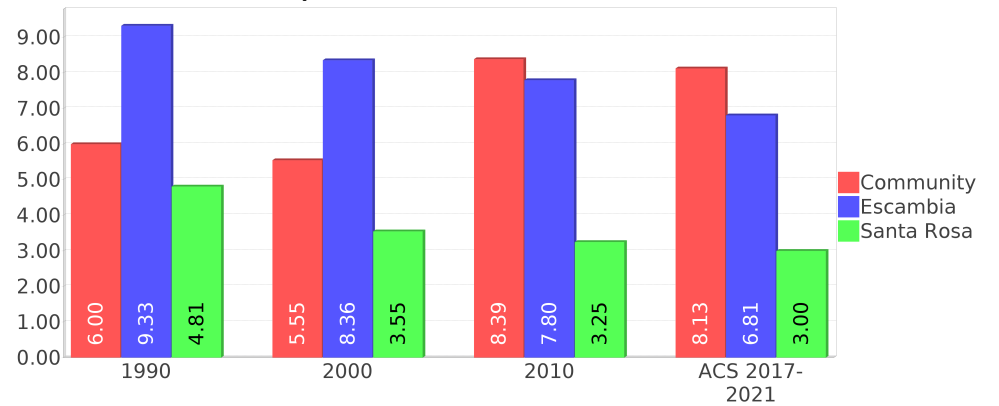
Housing Tenure

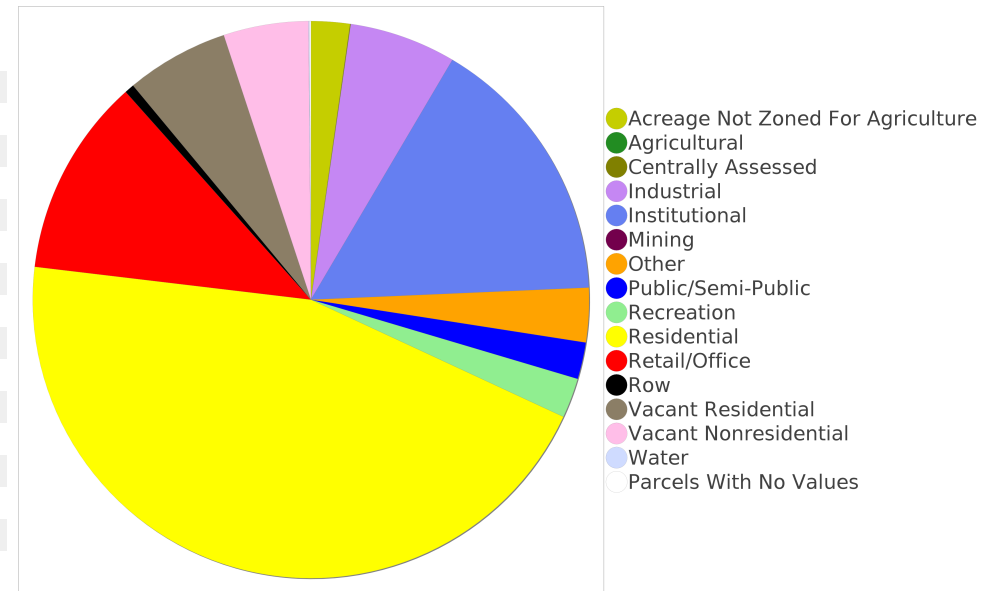

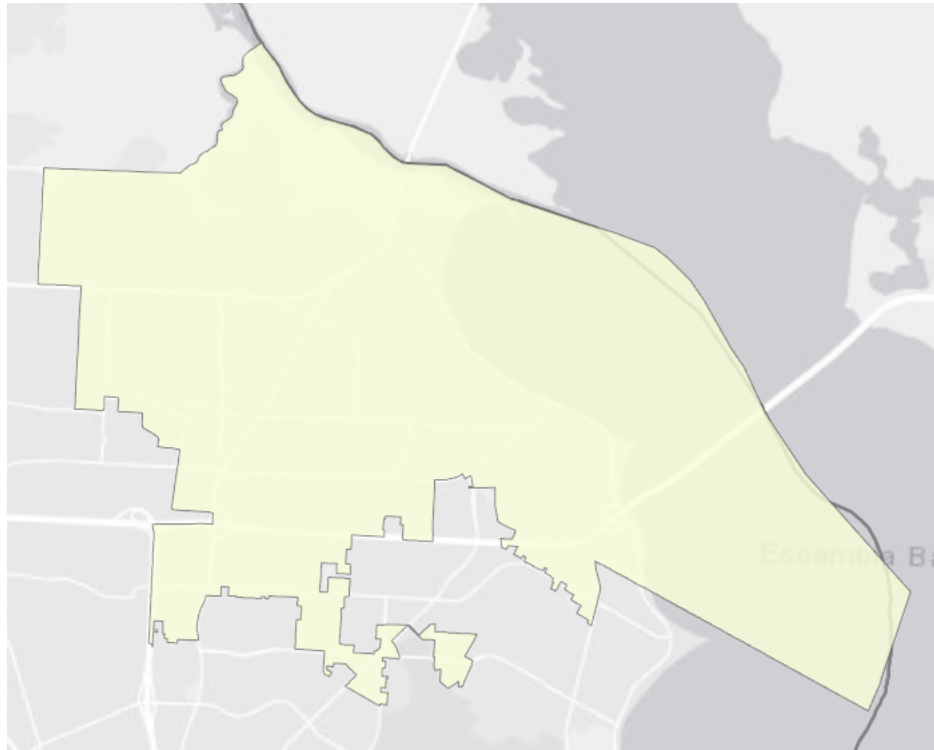

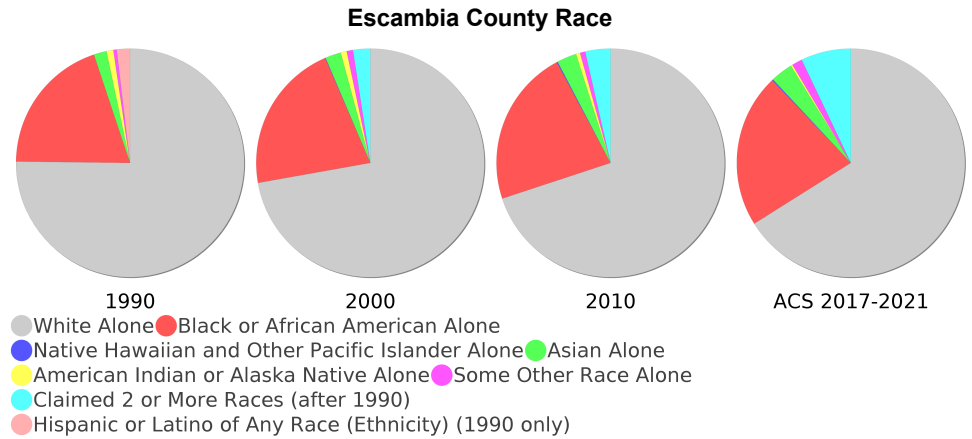

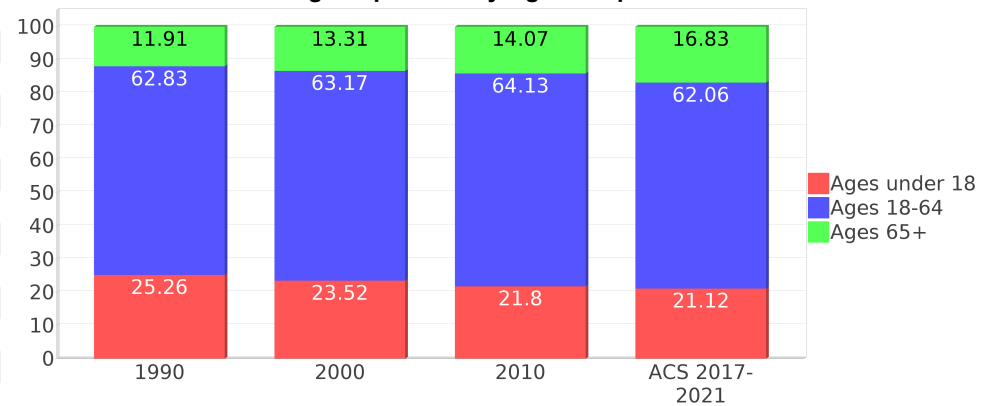

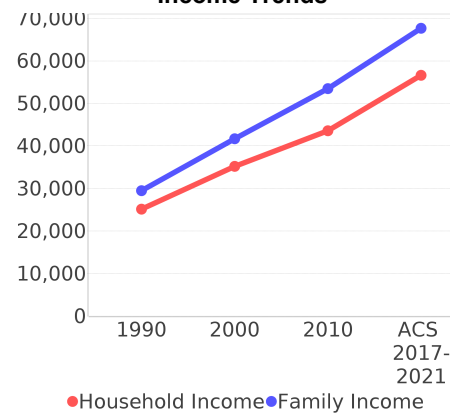

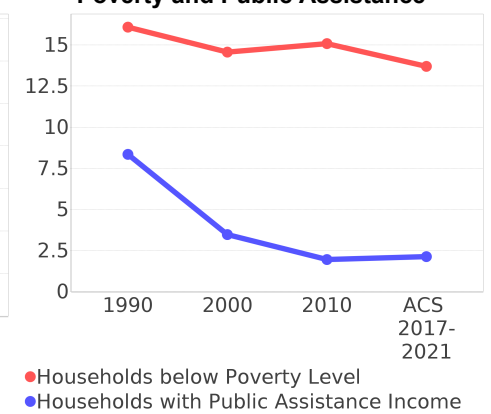

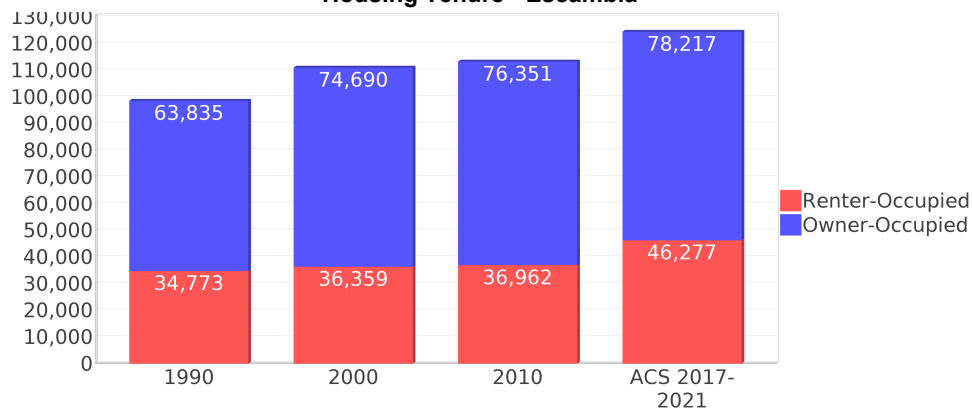

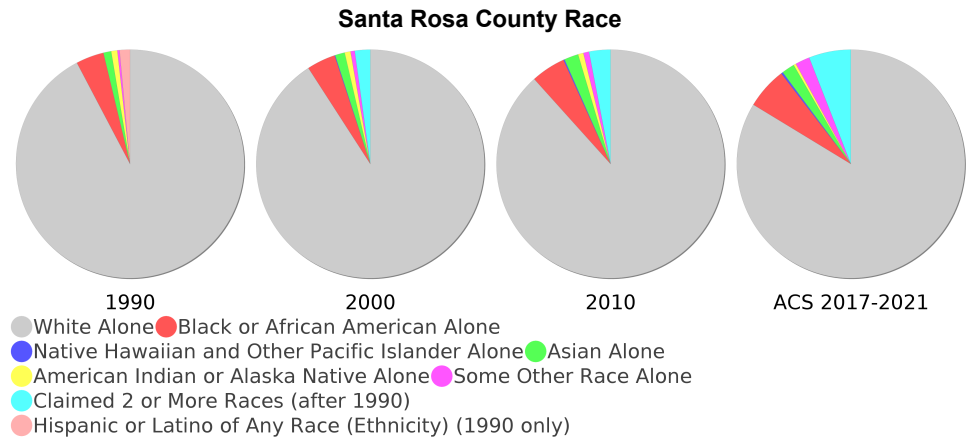

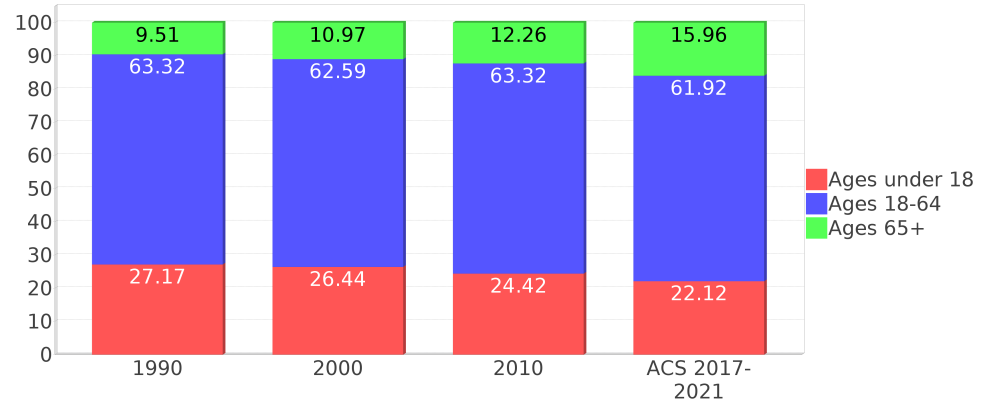

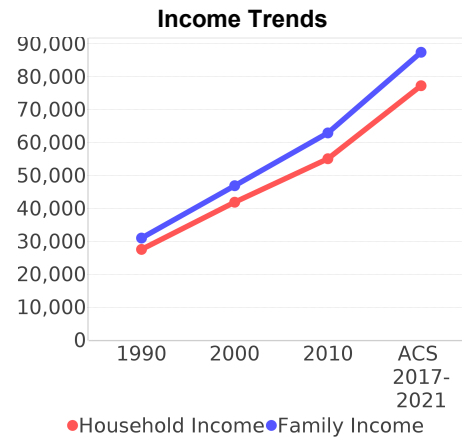

Percentage Population by Age Group - Santa Rosa

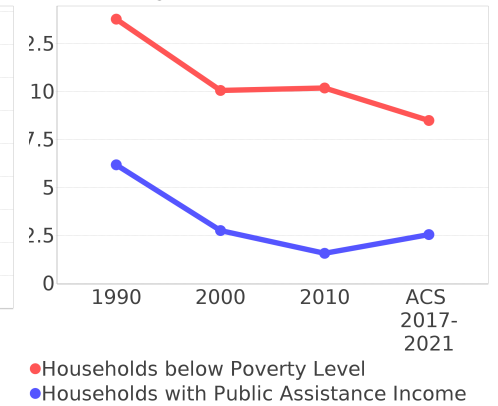

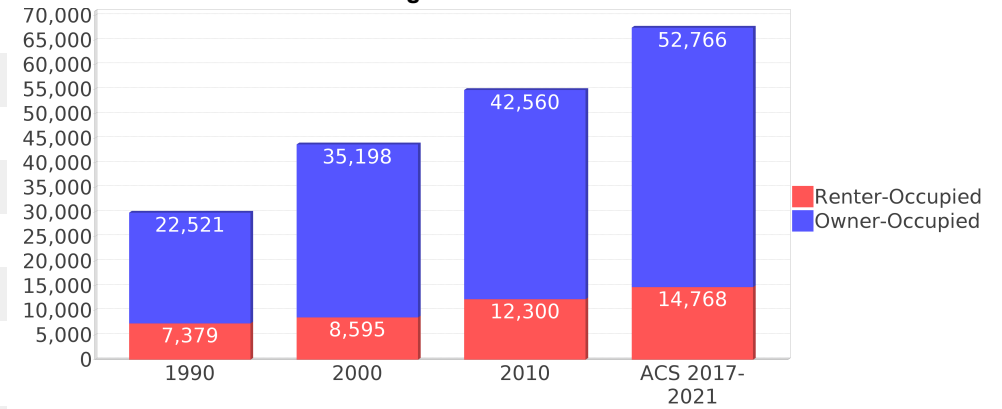
